



The Donald Trump Mugshot

Former U.S. President Donald Trump finds himself in the midst of a shocking development as news breaks of his recent arrest. Unsurprisingly, his mugshot was immediately sourced from Fulton County Jail's website and plastered across the internet. This mug shot makes history, as Trump is now the first president to undergo booking at a county jail. This now begs the question: What led to the ex-president's ignominious arrest, and where is he now?

The former president now finds himself in hot water, facing 91 official charges — 13 counts in Georgia, 4 counts in Washington, 40 counts in Florida, and 34 counts in New York — counts that have been accumulating well before his tenure in office. The charges that Trump faces in Georgia resulted from state charges of conspiracy to overturn the results of the 2020 presidential election in Georgia (Breuninger).

Trump is not alone in this case, as he is joined by a cohort of 18 co-defendants, including his lawyer and multiple high-ranking Republican Party members. However, many of the defendants are oblivious to the charges held against them; in an interview with Trump, he stated "Those people that have been so unfairly dragged into this, these are high-quality people who don't even know why they were brought in". Many of the co-defendants were manipulated and misled by the ex-president's associates to advance Trump's interests. Though the former president may show remorse, the media's scrutiny raises doubts regarding the sincerity of his statements.

In addition to Trump's charges from the 2020 presidential election, the former president also faces multiple counts of business-related fraudulent behavior. As of October 5th, Trump has finished the third day of his civil

fraud trial. The ex-president was accused of fraud when on the week of September 24th, it was ruled that he, along with his associates, inflated his assets. This granted him far better deals on commercial real estate loans as well as insurance policies. If found guilty, Trump and co. could be liable to pay hefty sums in damages for the profits they've allegedly garnered through their fraudulent business practices (Scannell). Recently, however, Trump and associates have been attempting to thwart trials and the dissolution of his businesses. Though trials are ongoing, the dissolution of Trump's businesses has been temporarily stopped. Left-wing politicians have been enraged by this development, as fraudulent behaviors including tax fraud could still ensue with Trump's businesses staying in business.

With multiple confirmed allegations and underhanded business approaches, this takes a

significant toll on Trump, as the people's perception of him has been damaged. As students, several of us will soon gain the right to vote, underscoring the importance of staying informed about ongoing political events. It's also advisable to scrutinize the authenticity of presidential representatives, as we wield considerable influence over the future of our respective nations.

Maui Fires: What happened and What's going on Now?

On August 8th, a devastating fire wiped out the entirety of Lahiana in a mere 3 days. Nearly 2,200 structures were destroyed by the fire in one night along with 97 people recorded dead (Hassan et al.). The fire's causes were originally unknown, starting off as a small bush fire the early morning of August 8th and later growing to wipe out homes throughout the rest of the day. Nearly a week after the fire, people speculated on its causes. Many people including local weather stations place the blame on climate as it's Hawaii's dry season. However, many people also put the blame on electrical companies, the main name being Hawaiian Electric (Mcdermott et al.). The trend of accusations eventually led to several lawsuits being filed weeks later against Hawaiian Electric which later would cause confession from the company itself. Hawaiian Electric confesses to the morning fire on August 8th but does not take the blame for the fire that followed the same afternoon (Chen et al.).

After the fire on August 8, several other areas of Maui caught fire as

well. The next day, West Maui reported a loss of landline and electricity due to the fire bringing down powerlines in the area (Alfonseca). After the fire cooled down for a few days, everyone began their search and rescue efforts for the missing people reported. The reported number of deceased people totaled 115 until more information filled gaps and the final number was narrowed down to 97. Many other bodies have not been identified due to the condition of the bodies themselves. 69 bodies have been identified thus far and 8 bodies are still in the process of being officially identified while 56 people remain unknown (Alfonseca). As of September 18, officials are still searching for missing people which is a changing number, from one day being 500 to another being 1,000 (Stieb).

Economically, calculations are estimated to cost about 5.5 billion USD for repairs and revival of tourism. Many citizens have lost their homes to the fire leaving thousands displaced left to rest at local hotels with provisions provided by Red Cross and other charitable organizations

(Hassan et al.). Along with material needs, Maui County provides counselors on-site to tend to the mental needs of the displaced citizens. Around September 25th, reentering citizens went back to previously restricted areas: the residential areas and commercial areas. The Maui Emergency Management Agency also provided assistance to the citizens in their return to the safer, previously-restricted areas to visit

homes and businesses (Alfonseca). Moreover, government officials in Maui also explained the situation on the restricted burn areas officials that are yet to go through. It is stated that it will take several months to almost a year before everything can be removed from the burn areas for safe return (Alfonseca).

What You Need to Know for the 2024 Taiwanese Presidential Election

In a few months, the Taiwanese people will be heading to polling stations and casting their ballots for a new leader. With the incumbent president Tsai Ing-Wen finishing her second term, she will be ineligible for re-election according to the Constitution. Past elections have always been dominated by the two major political parties in Taiwan — the Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) and the Kuomintang (KMT).

However, this might not be the case anymore for 2024. As of October 5, four candidates have been nominated by their respective parties and included in the majority of mainstream polls, making the upcoming election the most contested election since 2000.

Back in April, the ruling DPP nominated the current vice president William Lai to be its presidential candidate for 2024. This is not the first time the former mayor of Tainan City and Premier sought nomination for president, as he lost his last bid in 2020 to the current President Tsai Ingwen. Lai is seen as a supporter of Taiwan extending its sovereignty, contradicting China's views of the island as an inseparable part of its territory. His previous comments claiming to be a "practical worker for Taiwan independence" angered top officials in Beijing.

However, as the Taiwanese public and the Biden Administration prefer to remain at the status quo in Taiwan, Lai has reassured that Taiwan

is already an independent country so no changes have to be made. All major news outlets suggest that Lai is the frontrunner in the upcoming election, with most of them showing Lai is up by at least 10 percentage points.

After facing a tough competition in the primaries with billionaire Terry Gou, the current New Taipei City Mayor Hou You-yi successfully earned the ticket for KMT in July. The biggest opposition party in Taiwan suffered huge defeats from the past few elections due to its policies favoring closer ties with China. To regain the confidence of voters, Hou emphasized that he supports neither Taiwan's declaration of independence nor the "one country, two system" policy proposed by China to take back Taiwan.

Experts believed that his unclear stance on China will put him at a disadvantage; however, at the same time, he also appeals to centrist voters of both parties. Hou started his career as a police officer in the 1980s; he entered politics when serving as deputy mayor of New Taipei City. His popular domestic policies in Taiwan's most populated city led him to a landslide victory in the mayoral election last year.

Emerging as Taiwan's third major party, the Taiwan's People Party (TPP) is a prominent force in the upcoming election. Major news outlets often rank its chairman Ko Wen-je, a former surgeon and Taipei City mayor, second in polls behind

William Lai. As the only presidential candidate on TikTok and having more Instagram followers than President Tsai Ing-wen, his effective use of social media has helped him gain popularity among voters below the age of 40. Regarding his policies toward China, Ko said he would be happy to open dialogues and collaborate with Beijing without changing the current status of Taiwan.

Terry Gou, the founder of iPhone supplier Foxconn, also announced his candidacy for president as an independent after losing the KMT primaries. The charismatic businessman said that he will use his business success and good relations with China to bring peace in the region. He often called for more communication channels with Beijing to bring Taiwan "back from the abyss of war with China."

However, opinion polls show Guo's policies might not appeal

to the majority of Taiwanese public, as many of them are willing to defend their country from China. His campaign might also further divide the opposition's vote, making frontrunner William Lai the most likely candidate to win the election.

Military Aid from US to Taiwan Approved by Biden

The US Biden Administration has officially announced the transferral of military aid to Taiwan (CNN).

Under the approval of US military aid for Taiwan, the US Department of State has given a total of \$80 million USD to Taiwan, in addition to weaponry, ammunition, air defense systems, reinforced vehicles, drones, communication equipment, and protective equipment. It has also included support training for Taiwanese military forces (ABC News).

The program that has aided military support towards Taiwan is known as Foreign Military Financing (FMF). FMF is a US foreign policy that promotes a common goal of security in joint missions between the US and other foreign governments around the world. It centers around providing military defenses for foreign countries around the globe in support of peacekeeping missions and humanitarian relief efforts. Foreign Military Financing is also a program that is normally reserved for fully sovereign states. Thus, the approval of military aid from the US to Taiwan has led to increasing tensions between China and Taiwan. China has warned the US that Taiwan continues to be a part of China under the One China policy, while Taiwan has repeatedly rejected China's claims of sovereignty over Taiwan. The Taiwanese government has claimed that only the people of Taiwan can decide their own future and the future of their land.

However, the US Department of State has spoken up, claiming that providing Taiwan with military aid does not equate to recognizing Taiwan as a separate sovereign state from China. Rather, the US's sole purpose of providing Taiwan with military aid is to make sure that Taiwan is capable of self-defense. The US still recognizes the One China policy, which acknowledges the existence of one singular Chinese government. It differs from the One China principle, which states that Taiwan is a unified nation with China (BBC News). Below are quotes from US spokespersons from the US Department of State who have chosen to remain anonymous.

“Consistent with the Taiwan Relations Act and our longstanding One China policy, which has not changed, the United States makes available to Taiwan defense articles and services necessary to enable it to maintain a sufficient self-defense capability.”

“The United States has an abiding interest in peace and stability in the Taiwan Strait, which is critical to regional and global security and prosperity.”

Another quote from Michael McCaul, a US Republican Representative, who supports the decision to support Taiwan militarily, states the following:

“These weapons will not only help Taiwan and protect other democracies in the region, but also

strengthen the US deterrence posture and ensure our national security from an increasingly aggressive Chinese Communist Party.”

The Taiwanese government has claimed that only the people of Taiwan can decide their own future and the future of their land.

Previously, the US has engaged in military aid via a program—Foreign Military Sales (FMS). Unlike Foreign Military Financing, the FMS supplies foreign countries with weapons through purchases (CNN). Instead of having to wait for military supply production, the US (through the FMF program) now has Congress and presidential authority to supply Taiwan with weapons directly from US military supplies (Straits Times). Despite multiple objections and threats from China, the US has continued to participate in

military weaponry sales with Taiwan.

As of September 30th, Lahaina is undergoing recovery stages and is in the process of finishing off the current missing persons list and clearing up the area for safe return. One of the other big focuses of rescue in Lahaina is identifying the remaining deceased and getting in contact with their family (Alfonseca). As for returning to normal life for the displaced citizens, there is no official date yet. There is also no official date for the start of school. Many individuals are also due to stay at the shelters and hotels because of the vast amount of land not yet cleared for a safe return. Workers from the Environmental Protection Agency estimate that it will take months to safely clear each property of dangerous material (Alfonseca).

British Museum Antiques Scandal

Complaints against the British Museum in recent years have mostly centered around whether the museum has the right to hold onto the relics it possessed, with some believing that many of the relics in its collection, acquired in the nation's imperial days, should be returned to their countries of origin out of respect for the cultures that brought the artifacts into existence.

In August, a cultural industry scandal hit the British Museum in the United Kingdom, one of the most prominent cultural faculties in the world, when it was discovered that over 2,000 items from its collection of Graeco-Roman artifacts were missing, stolen or damaged (Shah). The scandal sparked concerns and skepticism about the museum's security protocols, and requests for the institution to return artifacts became an international consensus in countries such as China, Nigeria, Greece and Egypt (Mouriquand).

As justification for keeping possession of the relics, the British Museum argued that they observe a higher standard of care and organization for the artifacts compared to that of the countries where the artifacts originated from. However, recent scandals prompted concerns regarding the security and management of the British institution (Shah).

In response to the scandal, the Greek government renewed their calls for the return of the Parthenon Marbles, one of the oldest controversies surrounding the topic, with the first dating to 1983 (Sommerlad).

Greece's Minister of Culture, Lina Mendoni, said that the security concerns raised by the missing objects "reinforces the permanent and just demand of our country for the definitive return" of the Marbles,

"The loss, theft, deterioration of objects from a museum's collections is an extremely serious and particularly sad event," said the Greek minister. "In fact, when this happens from within, beyond any moral and criminal responsibility, a major question arises regarding the credibility of the museum organization itself." (Mouriquand).

In response to Mendoni, the chairman of the British Museum All-Party Parliamentary Group has accused Greece of "blatant opportunism" in claiming the museum is "not safe" following thefts from the museum (Shah).

Despina Koutsoumba, the head of the Association of Greek Archaeologists expresses her concerns on the amount of Greek artifacts missing from recent thefts (Mouriquand).

"We want to tell the British Museum that they cannot any more say that Greek culture heritage is more protected in the British Museum. It is obvious that it is very well protected in Greece and not in the British Museum." said Koutsoumba (Mouriquand).

According to Mendoni, the last assertion from Britain regarding the Parthenon Sculptures was that the artifacts will be "supposedly safer" in the British museum than in Acropolis Museum in Athens. Mendoni quickly pointed out the flaws in their argument. The British institution said that they plan to take "legal action" against Peter John Higgs, a senior curator of Greek and Roman art who had worked at the museum for three decades, who is the main suspect for the thefts. Many of the missing items were on sale on eBay (Mouriquand).

The British Museum has possessed the Parthenon sculptures since they were removed from the Acropolis of Athens in the early 19th century. The institution has repeatedly rejected Greece's requests for the repatriation of those historical relics. In spite of that, the Greek voices gained traction amid international calls for cultural institutions to decolonize their holdings (Mouriquand).

The news of the thefts heightened calls for the Benin bronzes' return from the Nigerian government. The institution reports that it received a written request for the return of "Nigerian antiquities" from Nigeria's Federal Ministry of Information and Culture in October 2021 and that representatives of the Benin Royal Palace have made a number of public statements calling for their return (Sommerlad).

Abba Isa Tijani pointed out the irony of the institution's argument that their artifacts would be safer in the British Museum. "It's shocking to hear that the countries and museums that have been telling us that the Benin bronzes would not be secure in Nigeria have thefts happening there." (Sommerlad).

The Global Times, China's state-run newspaper, asked for the return of over 23,000 Chinese artifacts currently in the custody of the museum.

The editorial mentioned that "the vast majority of the British Museum's huge collection of up to eight million items came from countries other than the U.K., and a significant portion of it was acquired through improper channels, even dirty and sinful means." The topic of looted Chinese artifacts has gained traction on social platforms in China, as Chinese netizens demand the return of the relics (Sommerlad).

Zahi Hawass, Egypt's former minister of state for antiquities has been campaigning for the return of Egypt's Rosetta Stone for years. "It is the time Egyptian identity comes back home. We are not asking the British Museum to return the 100,000 Egyptian pieces they have, we just ask them to return one item," Dr Hawass said (Sommerlad). Hawass urged both UNESCO and the Egyptian Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities to organize an international conference to discuss both the risks of keeping valuable artefacts in the British Museum and steps to repatriate them to their rightful homelands, and he described the thefts as nothing short of a global catastrophe and a grievous crime

against world heritage (El-Aref).

The missing artifacts and the campaigns for the return of looted relics are not the only controversies surrounding the British institution. The National reported that the museum had purchased an ancient Egyptian artifact from a convicted smuggler in New York (Tahir).

All in all, this invention has not only saved lives; it has also become the grand invention that we see today. It is now the punctuation mark that delicately forms the thread between ideas with more grace than any other mark before it.

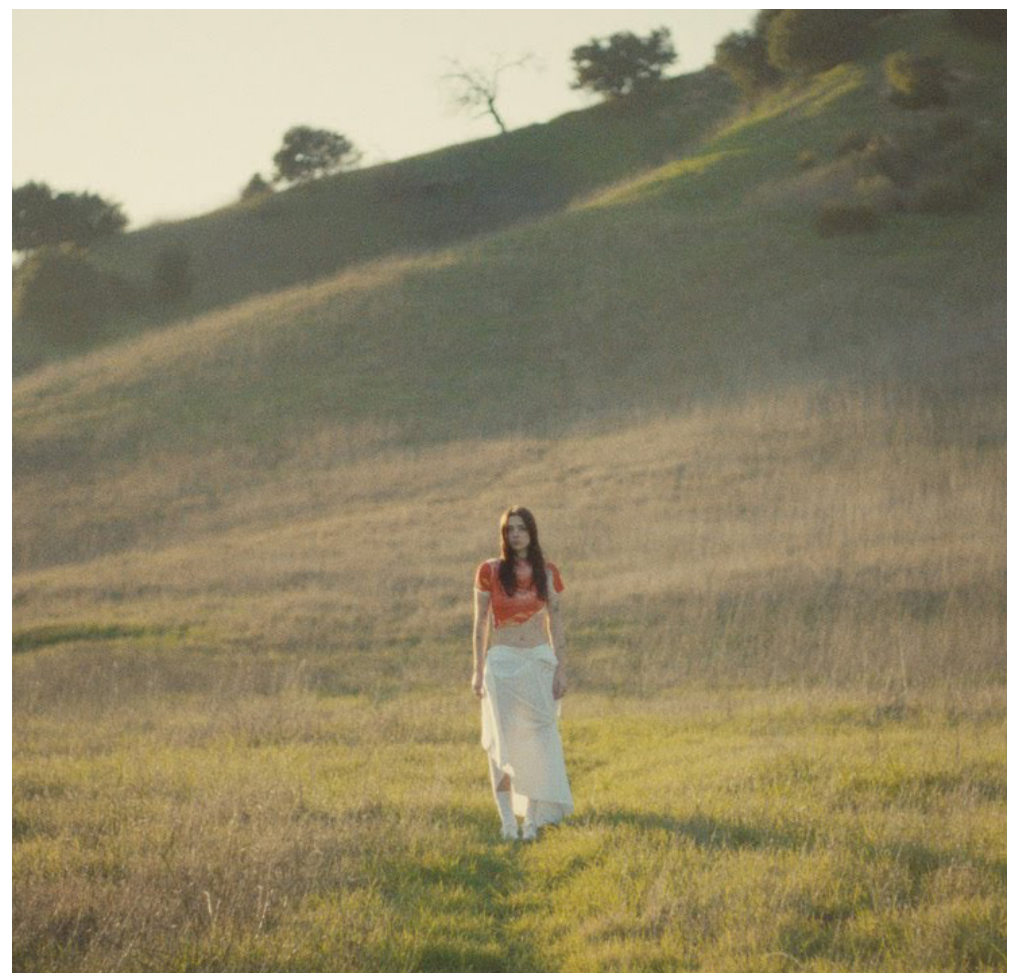
In the song, it sounds like she actually has a boyfriend and a lover, but the

From the Start - Laufey

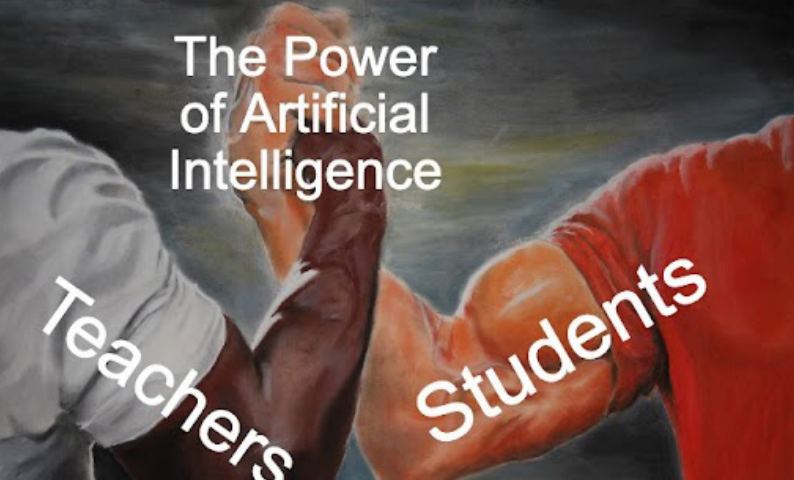
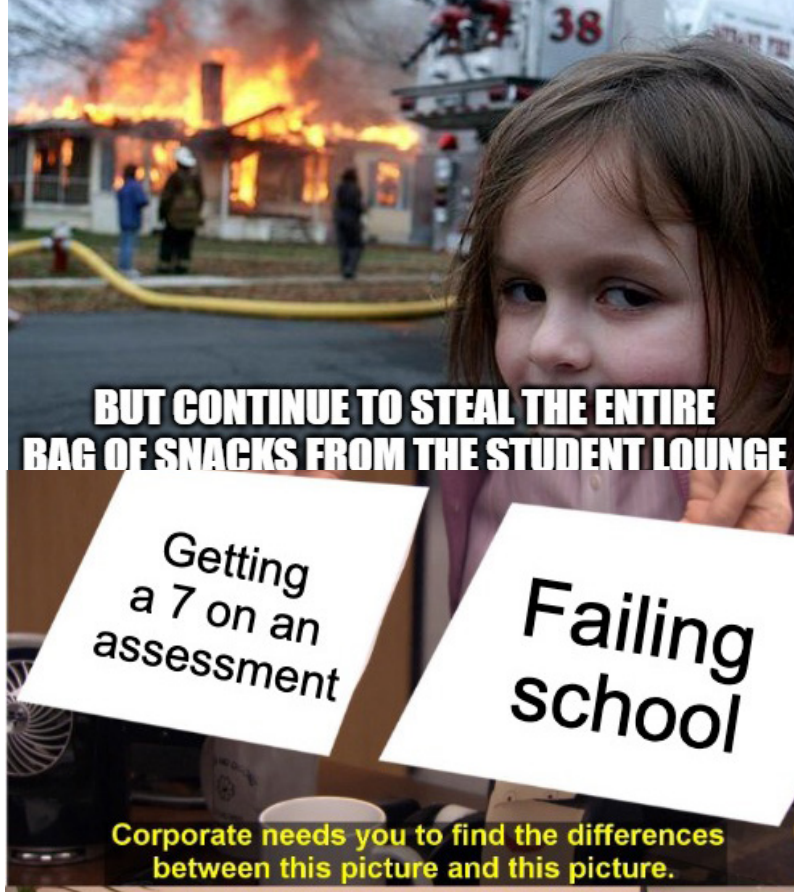
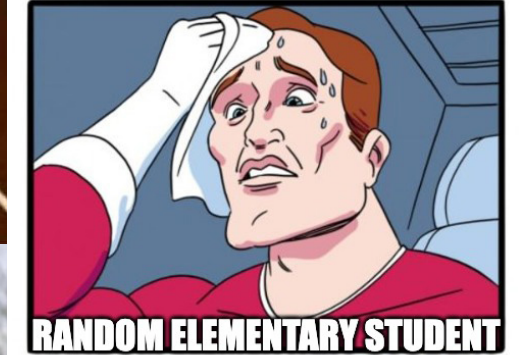
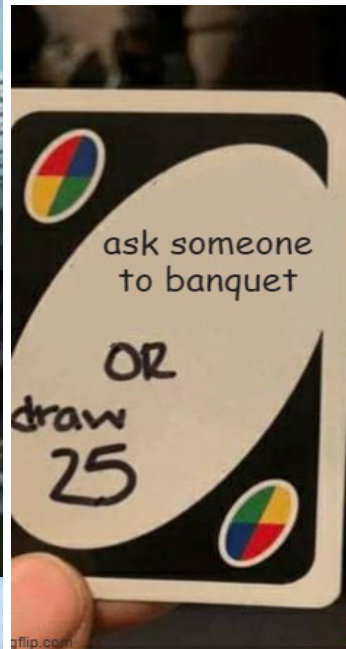
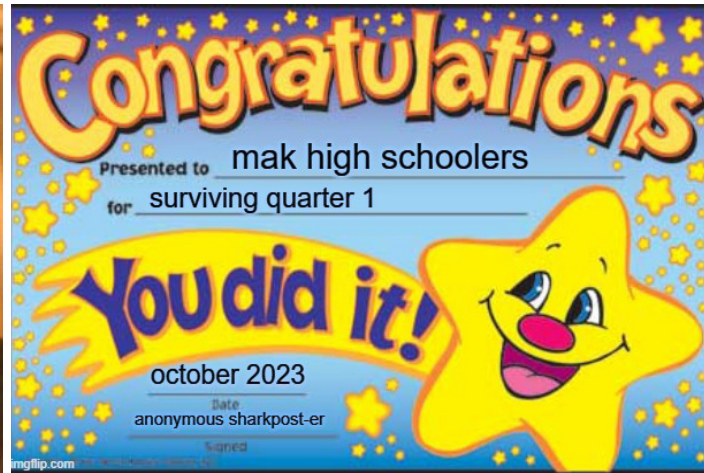
