Container Classrooms Not the Best. Is There Anything Else?

“The containers just don't work,” one student said, “one time it barely rained and the mud around the door flooded the entrance.” “I used to think the classroom fans were the problem. They're louder this time.” A teacher said,

With Taichung's repairs underway, many teachers and students started to take strong stands in the container classrooms. The long running project is projected to finish about ten years from now. Ever since school started, many people, particularly middle school and high school departments, have become accustomed to the new container classrooms. Many complaints come through with the student and faculty bodies. A series of questions were asked to passing students, in which, many gave answers with negative connotations. Below is a chosen sample of interviews conducted January 18, 2024, Thursday.

“Would you say the noise level is better or worse than being in your normal classrooms?”

“Sometimes my teacher's voice echoes some words after he says it, or is that just me?” a student answered, “anyway, it's way worse than being inside the main building classrooms. If you think the 5 minute break during a full block is loud, just think about it inside a full metal classroom, where the walls echo every sound made inside.”

“Oh it's way worse. You know, one benefit to it though? None of us yell because it's going to kill our own eardrums. No point in hurting ourselves, right?” Another student answered.

“How neat and clean would you say the classrooms are?”

This question was asked to a group of students passing by.

“Oh the desks and chairs and stuff are neat, not so much the floor though,” one group member said, “the floor is super dusty, putting anything down is a hazard for real.”

“Yeah, you can't really sit anywhere else except for the tables and desks which stinks because sometimes I feel like I'm getting bed sores for sitting so long,” another member noted.

Although this solution is definitely not long-term for the following ten years to come, both schools believe this is the most viable option as of now. Travel and several other details are not yet finalized but it is indeed confirmed that our fellow Taichung siblings are going to become inhabitants of our very own classrooms.

After an unprecedented abstain vote by the People's Republic of China, the Security Council and the General Assembly adopted a resolution allowing Taiwan to be readmitted as a UN member state under the name "Republic of China." To celebrate this historical occurrence, Secretary-General António Guterres has invited the best MUN Club from Taiwan to represent their respective countries in the upcoming conference. Looking to extend its dominance across multiple MUN conferences in Taiwan, the MAK MUN Club is sending its members to the UN Headquarters in New York City, looking for another W.

The Republic of China (ROC), the United States, Australia, Canada, and Malaysia were among the countries MAK MUN members represented. Perhaps still dissatisfied with Taiwan joining the UN, the People's Republic of China has declined to offer a spot for MAK. "We would not allow naive high school students to represent our

great nation." Ambassador Jasper Lai, the actual delegate of PRC, said in a press conference before the session started.

This year's General Assembly Third Committee (GA3) has sustainable access to safe and clean water for all as its focus. Students Spotted Floating in MAK Science Room

Students at Morrison Academy Kaohsiung (MAK) were spotted floating inside the high school Science Room. Upon investigation, it was revealed that this phenomenon was the result of a biology project on Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs). *Cucurbita volare*, a new species of pumpkin, was developed in a collaboration between ninth-grade Biology students and their teacher.

charts.

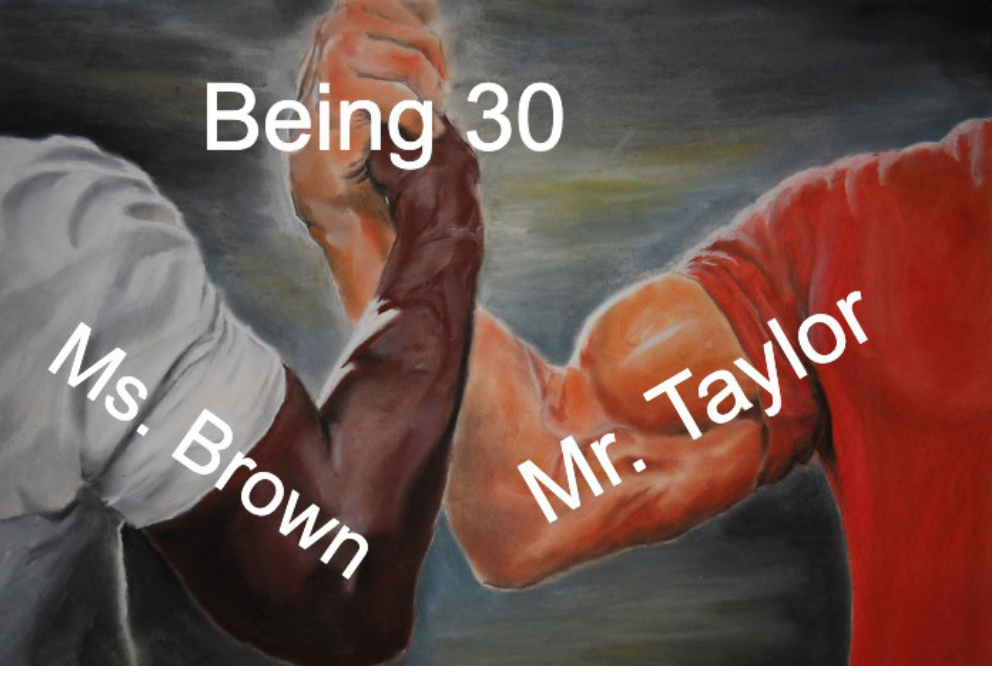
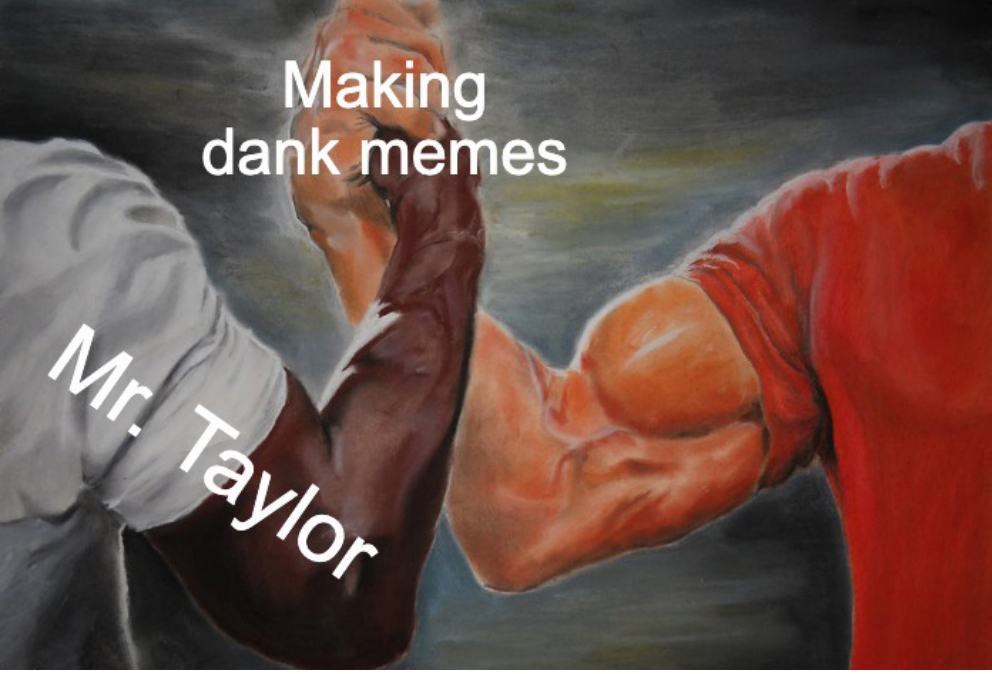
